Gypsy

Gypsies are a race of the NERO International 8th Edition Rule Book. As a race they may purchase the skill Gypsy Curse/Remove Gypsy curse for 2 build points.

Clans—Midjloli

The Midjloli Gypsies are a tribe which has become almost exclusively seafaring. Most of them can be found on large floating "sea caravans," which are easily identifiable by the brightly colored sails. Some, however, choose to command small, darkly painted clippers, well suited to nighttime smuggling. While life at sea takes them out of contact with the rest of the Familia, they are no less close to their brethren. Every year, at midsummer, they meet in the middle of Gulf of Whitehaven, tie together their ships, and have a gathering.

Being seafaring, the Midjloli Gypsies have become especially superstitious about the weather. They will avoid casting Stone or Fire spells (as to not anger the Air and Water), and prefer Healing elixirs to healing potions. Those causing bad luck are usually forced to remedy it by paying homage to the offended element.

Clans—Karbaro

The Karbaro Gypsies are mostly tinkerers and traders. They are a rather small and isolated tribe, living mostly in the northern Tundra. Their isolation has led to the development of a rather distinct pronunciation and dialect, with which they pepper their language. The Karbaro were once more populous, but were almost decimated by a feud: Two brothers had each taken planar transforms from opposing planes. Their battle spilled into the rest of the clan, with Karbaro taking the side of one brother or the other. The Karbaro would have eliminated themselves entirely, if not for the direct intervention of the Kris. The brothers were both declared Marhime for pointlessly raising blade against another Gypsy, and causing others to do the same. The brothers were race changed to human, banished and their names were to be never spoken again. The Karbaro have since eschewed planar alliances, and will not accept transforms on their spirits.
